Policy Statement

Govt. National College, Sirsa strictly follows a **Zero Tolerance Policy towards ragging** in any form. Ragging is a punishable offence as per the directions of the **Hon'ble Supreme Court of India**, the **UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions**, 2009, and the **Haryana State Government Guidelines**.

The institution is committed to ensuring a safe, respectful, and fear-free learning environment for all students.

What Constitutes Ragging?

Ragging includes one or more of the following acts:

- Any conduct that causes or is likely to cause physical, psychological, or emotional harm.
- Teasing, abusing, or making derogatory remarks against any student.
- Forcing a student to perform acts that he/she would normally not do.
- Bullying, intimidation, or humiliation in physical, verbal, or online form.
- Any act of abuse by spoken words, emails, or public insult.

Anti-Ragging Committee

An **Anti-Ragging Committee** has been constituted in the college to ensure implementation of regulations and to take immediate action in case of complaints.

Anti-Ragging Measures

- 1. **Undertaking:** Every student and parent must submit an *Anti-Ragging Undertaking* at the time of admission.
- 2. **Awareness:** Regular awareness campaigns, seminars, and displays of anti-ragging posters across the campus.
- 3. **Helpline:** Dedicated phone numbers and email IDs for students to report ragging incidents.
- 4. **Surveillance:** Strict monitoring in classrooms, hostels, canteens, and common areas.
- 5. Counselling: Guidance and counselling sessions for freshers and senior students.

Punishments for Ragging

Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence, any student found guilty of ragging may face:

- Suspension from classes.
- Debarring from appearing in examinations.
- Withholding results.
- Cancellation of admission.
- Expulsion from hostel/college.
- FIR with local police authorities.

Complaint & Helpline

- Any student subjected to or witnessing ragging may immediately approach the Anti-Ragging Committee or lodge a complaint via helpline/email.
- Complaints will be treated with confidentiality and prompt action will be taken.
